Presentation

The fifth international conference of Predynastic and Early Dynastic Studies marks the continuation of the previous successful conferences which happens every three years: <u>Kraków 2002</u>, <u>Toulouse 2005</u>, <u>London 2008</u> and <u>New York 2011</u>. This five-day international event will gather in Cairo a network of experts from different countries. They will present and discuss their respective research relating a significant range of themes within the broader subject of the origins of the Egyptian State (from the Predynastic period to the beginning of the Old Kingdom). This Fifth international conference marks a new stage in the momentum acquired by Predynastic and Early Dynastic studies.

Topics

Topics developed during the colloquium concern all aspects of Predynastic and Early Dynastic Egypt. Papers and posters will be organised around the following themes:

- Craft specialisation, technology and material culture
- Upper-Lower Egypt interactions
- Deserts-Nile Valley interactions
- Egypt and its neighbours (Levant, Nubia, Sahara)
- Birth of writing
- Absolute and relative chronology
- Cult, ideology and social complexity
- Results of recent fieldwork

Communications

During the first five days of the conference (13-17 April 2014), speakers will present results of studies concerning the origins of Egypt (4th millennium BC/beginning of the 3rd millennium BC). Sessions will be also specifically devoted to the presentation of posters. Sixth day (18 April 2014) will be dedicated to a scientific excursion in the Nile Delta.

Abstracts will be evaluated by an international scientific committee that will establish the final list of selected papers. Organisers reserve the right to place oral presentations into posters, or vice versa.

Proceedings

The proceedings volume for Origins5 will be published by <u>Peeters Publishers, Leuven</u>, in their <u>Orientalia</u> <u>Lovaniensia Analecta (OLA) series</u>, continuing the series of volumes from the earlier Origins conferences. Participants are invited to submit their manuscripts for the proceedings. All papers will be reviewed by at least two international experts.

The deadline for the submission of manuscripts is **1**st **July 2014**. Guidelines for authors follow below. To reduce any delay in publication, the scientific committee would be grateful if the participants supply their articles during the conference.
